MONET	Taller César De la Peña	Aprender a Convivir	La charla versa sobre la educación en y para la convivencia en las escuelas; ello, desde la premisa de que la reciente pandemia por COVID 19, no sólo mermó considerablemente la calidad de los aprendizajes, sino también, lamentablemente, hizo estragos en la convivencia, en las relaciones interpersonales necesarias para la construcción grupal y la apropiación de aprendizajes significativos, dificultó el desarrollo de la inteligencia emocional, el trabajo colaborativo, la adquisición del cómulo de aprendizajes que conlleva la resolución de los conflictos -inherentes a toda relación entre individuos-, la negociación de ideas y la toma de decisiones compartidas. Por otra parte, tampoco, hizo posible el contacto necesario para propiciar el juego en el salón y en el patio escolar, ni la exploración y aprenciación de las posibilidades artisticas, propias y de los demás, en fin, entre otras muchas cosas, hizo muy dificil el desarrollo de competencias, tanto de aprendizaje, como de enseñanza.
